## How to read this report

**Percent Agree or Disagree** indicates the percent of respondents who answered Agree/Strongly Agree or Disagree/Strongly Disagree to a given statement.

**School Average** indicates the average numerical response among all respondents. These averages can help the reader understand how strongly respondents felt about a statement. Small differences between averages are not meaningful. The scale used was:
